

#### **Board of Directors**

The Square Butte Ranch development is a "bare land" condominium project. The responsibility for managing the property falls to a Condominium Corporation and its volunteer board of directors, elected by the owners at each annual general meeting.

### **Ranch Management and Staff**

The board engages the assistance of a number of staff members, two professional firms and a property management firm.

The board also engages the MD of Foothills to assist with the operation of our water facilities and Reliance Asset Consulting to prepare our Reserve Report.

Our ranch lawyer has been Sandy Cameron for the last few years and our ranch chartered accountant has been Don Hyde of Hyde & Hull. Don has retired and Cody Hull is now our auditor. Sandy assists with such things as our compliance with the law as it applies to condominium properties and Cody prepares our audited financial statements.

Renaissance Management, headed by Bob Lunge, is our manager. Bob and his team assist with our administration including financial administration. Bob also assists the board directly by attending every second board meeting and sharing his experience from other condominium projects.

Our ranch staff consists of two Maintenance Managers. Clay Campbell and Doug Peters are our ranch Maintenance Managers. They report to the board of directors generally and more particularly to the Operation Committee of the board of directors.




Clay Campbell lives in the Priddis area on a large acreage, owns performance horses and has two top barrel racing daughters. He is a professional fly fisherman/guide and also provides driving services for the movie industry. Part of the movie job is supplying vintage vehicles as required. Clay has worked in the oilfield services management business for most of his life both domestically and internationally. In his work life he has managed the workover and repair of hundreds of wells in Russia and Kazakhstan before retiring 15 years ago. He is familiar with large equipment and hydraulics, electrical, engine and safety management systems. On top of that he has a great understanding of computers and their applications.

Doug Peters lives on an acreage 8kms from SBR on Hwy 549 with his wife, who works in real estate, and his three offspring. Two of his kids are pursuing higher learning in Calgary at SAIT and U of C and the youngest attends high school. The Peters family is active in sports and the community. They own horses that are used for pleasure and hunting.

Doug was born in Northern Manitoba and in addition to working at the ranch is employed with the Calgary Fire Department. As such Doug is expert in general and fire safety, electrical and other fire hazard identification and in training people in the preceding skills.

He is also skilled in making repairs, doing builds/ rebuilds, operating machinery including small engines and heavy equipment and in general problem solving. Doug is experienced in working with vendors/service providers to gain consensus on project planning and execution.



Clay and Doug job-share the position, with Clay generally working an average of 20 hours a week and Doug generally working an average of 12 hours per week. They manage and clear our roads, maintain and repair our common area buildings, maintain our common areas including summer mowing, maintain and store our ranch equipment, assist with the maintenance of our water system (with the MD of Foothills, our water management contractor, and Alberta Environment), assist with the recording of water use and over use by owners and generally assist the Operations Committee of the Condo Board as necessary. They work cooperatively with Lori Collins, the Ranch Club's Barn

Barn Manager **Lori Cloakey-Collins** tells us "I was born and raised in the area, so it just makes sense that I fell in love with the Cowboy lifestyle: I was born with a pair of cowboy boots on and I haven't taken them off since. Always around horses and currently owning 6 horses of my own, which I use for absolutely everything from hunting to ranch work.


I ride out at Tongue Creek Ranch and Buffalo Head Ranch riding pasture and help gather cattle for the brandings. Recently, I have started roping, but definitely not as good as the cowboys who do it daily. Maybe one day.

Riding with Gary Thompson is one of my favorite things to do. We take the cattle to the Forestry for summer grazing and bring them back for the Winter. Cattle drives are just fun. Checking cattle out in the mountains is quite the experience as nothing beats riding in the mountains.

Aside from working at Square Butte, I have led many guiding and outfitting trips for hunters. Organizing these adventures is a lot of work but so worth it. High up in the mountains Sheep Hunting ... no words to describe this experience.

I have the best old campaigners for teaching people to ride, including the littles. Watching their faces when riding is probably one of the best things to see.

We currently have 20 horses on the property, all with different personalities and quirks. My job scope is to care for all of them and ensure that they are healthy. Sometimes a challenge as we have many horses here with health issues. We have quite a few metabolic horses which means that they could founder if not watched carefully. Some of the horses have been here for years and years. Everyone knows them and loves them.



A big part of my job is caring for the land. So that is why we do rotational grazing, and you will see horses all over the place. And with the grazing of horses we are able to keep the risk of fire down. It is their job to graze on old dead grass (thatch).

I spend loads of time harrowing and cutting trails out West in the Spring/ Summer. And then in winter putting round bales everywhere.

There are many other things that we do and if you ever have questions please feel free to stop by and have a visit. There is always something happening at the barn so I will keep you posted.

And when you see my truck/trailer here, well that means I will be riding that day. And if you would like to come, tack up a horse and let's go!!!!"

Erin Creegan-Dogherty was hired by Lori because she was working 7 days a week and needed to cut down on her work schedule here at the Ranch. Erin was a natural fit.

Erin's been riding since before she could walk, and she lives on the Ranch which provides a way to support owners outside the times that Lori is on site and allows Lori to have weekends off.

Erin has extensive experience in the horse world. She has participated in competitive jumping, taught at lesson barns, dabbled in barrel racing, roping and dressage. She has done guiding and served on the Foothills Search and Rescue team and Equine Search and Rescue with her horse Jill. Erin has also apprenticed under cowboys such as Kent Williamson and has experience in doing Cowboy Challenges and other various Clinics.



If you look out in the pasture behind the townhomes you will also see Rowan, a Dutch/Belgium Warmblood that Erin bred 5 years ago – he is a big boy who she hopes will be a big jumper... though right now all he wants to do is cuddle.

In her "other" life Erin is taking International Business at Mount Royal Collage in Calgary. Erin will graduate in April!
